Holy Trinity Sunday; June 4th

The doctrine of the Trinity invites us to consider how a God constituted by relationship—the Father with the Son, the Son with the Spirit, the Spirit with the Father—draws us into that relationship with God and one another. Gradually or suddenly, through the work of the Spirit, we come to know our belonging to the Father and to Christ's body.

In such loving relationships, truth is discovered. But people cannot bear the truth all at once, so discipleship and faith formation are gradual processes of listening for the Spirit's voice. Christian practices such as worship, learning, and service are occasions for people of all ages to be "guided into truth." Such practices are rooted in baptism, in which God draws us into a lifelong relationship in which we grow into truth and love over time—guided by the Spirit, accompanied by Jesus, and having peace with the Father.

In Romans, we hear the truth of how love originates and grows in us: Poured into our hearts by the Holy Spirit, God's love gives us a hope that will never disappoint. Christian community offers the delightful opportunity to experience one's own growth in hope, faith, and love, and to witness others' growth as they too are drawn more deeply into relationship with the triune God.

Growing Together in

Faith, Hope and Love

On Monday, June 12th, Pastor Howard and six other ambassadors from the Northeastern Iowa Synod (NEIAS) will be headed to Hungary! This is the inaugural trip for people on the congregational level to engage with our



Lutheran brothers and sisters in Christ in Hungary. The NEIAS and Hungary are companion synods, and the focus of the trip is to develop relationships. We'll spend the first week in Budapest on the Pest side of the city, one block away from the Danube River. We'll travel to Balaton Lake (the largest lake in Central Europe) to spend a couple days at a Lutheran retreat center. The second week will be spent in the city of Pecs. The Lutheran Hungarians are excited to receive us and share their stories. Pastor Howard is the only ambassador from the Central/Western part of the NEIAS

selected to participate. Please keep Pastor Howard and the six other ambassadors in your prayers. We will return on Monday, June 26^{th} .

We want to let our Bethany Members know that there have been a few changes made to the "All Families Serving Bethany" agenda and that we will be putting the new booklets in your mailboxes in the coming week. We ask that you pick them up at your convenience. Booklets not picked up by July will be mailed, so please help us save on this expense.

The last booklet we were working from was done in 2019, a lot of new faces and departures have taken place. Our Co-chairs met and did our best to update the names and phone numbers, but as you have a chance to review if there are any corrections that need to be made please let us know.

We are expanding the use of our lists to serve two purposes:
